This Board solicitation of proxies is made on behalf of all of the candidates who have provided The Aleut Corporation (Corporation) with the required documentation to be included on the proxy for the Annual Meeting of Shareholders to be held at the Egan Convention Center at 555 West Fifth Avenue, Anchorage, Alaska on Saturday, October 12, 2019 at 9:00 a.m. local time, and any adjournments thereof.

PROXY HOLDERS

The proxy holders are Thomas Mack, President & CEO, and David Nevzuroff, Assistant Secretary/Treasurer, both of whom are employees of the Corporation, 4000 Old Seward Highway, Suite 300, Anchorage, Alaska 99503.

FILING OF PROXIES

Proxies allow you to vote whether you attend the Annual Meeting of Shareholders or not and are counted to establish a quorum at the meeting. The proxy form directs the named proxy holders to cast votes for nominees for the Board of Directors in the manner you direct.

In order for the Annual Meeting of Shareholders to be held in a timely manner, all Corporation proxies and any other proxy must be received on or before 5:00 p.m. Alaska Standard Time, October 8, 2019 by the election judge Sramek Hightower, CPAs, P.O. Box 240569, Anchorage, Alaska 99524-9968. Enclosed for your convenience is a postage-paid envelope for mailing your proxy form. Proxies received after 5:00 p.m. October 8, 2019 will not be voted at the meeting unless there is not a quorum. In that case, proxies received by Sramek Hightower at the Annual Meeting by the close of registration on October 12, 2019 or other extension deadline, will be voted.

REVOCATION OF PROXIES

A proxy is revocable by a shareholder voting by ballot at the Annual Meeting by writing delivered to the Corporation stating that the proxy is revoked, or by filing a later dated proxy with the election judge Sramek Hightower, CPAs, before 5:00 p.m. Alaska Standard Time on October 8, 2019, or if there is not a quorum, then by filing a proxy before the close of registration at noon on October 12, 2019.

VOTING SHARES

Shareholders with voting stock on the record date at 5:00 p.m. Alaska Standard Time on August 16, 2019 are entitled to vote at the Annual Meeting. Each shareholder may vote for one person, or split votes among as many candidates as the shareholder chooses.

If your proxy or ballot casts more votes than you are entitled to vote, your proxy or ballot will not be voted in the election of Directors but will be counted for quorum purposes only. If you cast fewer votes than you are entitled to vote, your unused votes will be used for quorum purposes only. If you do not check any boxes, your proxy will be counted for quorum purposes, but it will not be voted for any candidates. If you check boxes but do not show the number of votes for each candidate, your votes will be distributed equally among the candidates you choose. For instructions on how to vote your paper proxy see page 12.

WAYS TO VOTE

A shareholder may send a proxy to the election judge by mail, fax, or the internet. To mail a proxy, mail it in the postage paid envelope provided. To fax a proxy, send it to the election judge's fax number, (907) 561-4341. To send an electronic proxy, follow the detailed instructions for electronic voting that appear online and in this booklet on page 11. Your PIN and shareholder ID numbers to vote online are included on your written proxy.

VOTING SHARES HELD UNDER CUSTODIANSHIP

The enclosed proxy form states that the proxy grants power "to vote all of the shares of the Corporation which I could vote, including all shares for which I am custodian." This means that by signing the proxy, you will be granting a proxy with respect to shares owned by you in your own right (if any), and as custodian for each minor for whom you are custodian. You do not need to sign more than one proxy form to grant a proxy for all shares you are entitled to vote.

Total remuneration distributed or accrued for all Directors, Officers and the five highest paid employees of the Corporation as a group for the year ended March 31, 2019, was \$2,452,817.88. There were 15 persons constituting this group. Directors were compensated for services during the year ended March 31, 2019 as follows: Directors of the Corporation are paid a Director's fee of \$600 per day for each full day (\$300 for less than a full day) they meet to attend Board of Director and Committee meetings, subsidiary meetings or other functions on behalf of the Corporation. Full days are deemed to be three hours or more. The total amount of Directors' fees for the fiscal year ended March 31, 2019, was \$232,500. Directors also have access to \$5,000 annually for Board training. Directors are given a monthly stipend of \$1,000 per Director. Directors also received reimbursement for actual and reasonable travel related expenses for attending meetings and other functions on behalf of the Corporation. Per diems are paid according to the current federal government rate. The total amount of Directors' travel, per diem and reimbursable expenses paid for the year ended March 31, 2019, was \$104.336.29.

The Aleut Corporation has no committee which performs nominating functions. The Corporation does not have a "management slate" and does not nominate candidates for director.

PROXY SOLICITATION

The expense of solicitation of proxies, including the cost of preparing, printing, and mailing the Notice of Annual Meeting and Proxy Statement will be borne by the Corporation. In order to assure a quorum at the Annual Meeting of Shareholders, radio, television, and newspaper advertisements may be used. The Corporation may compensate certain persons for the time and expenses incurred in connection with the gathering of proxies. Excluding costs of attorneys, accountants, advertisements, renting, and salaries of regular employees, all of which would normally be expected in the Annual Meeting in the absence of a contest, anticipated costs for this solicitation are not more than \$10,000. Individual candidates for the Board may make additional solicitation for proxies. The cost of these solicitations will be borne by the individual candidates, except that those who succeed in gaining a seat on the Board are entitled to reimbursement of documented expenses up to \$2,000. Thus, the maximum individual reimbursement that will be made by the Corporation is \$2,000.

INDEPENDENT PUBLIC ACCOUNTANTS

The principal independent public accountant for the fiscal year is Grant Thorton LLP ("Grant Thorton") was selected by the Board of Directors to audit and advise on the financial statements of the Corporation.

Representatives of Grant Thorton LLP are expected to be present at the shareholders' meeting and will be available to respond to appropriate questions.

The audit function includes the independent public accountants' examination and their opinion on the financial statements and reports to shareholders, consultant during the year on matters related to accounting and related to the audit examination and advice. 

PIN Number – needed for online proxy submission and accessing the webcast of the Annual Meeting. Cumulative Votes – number of votes you are entitled to vote.

CASTING YOUR VOTES

The Aleut Corporation is required by Alaska statutes to provide cumulative voting. There is a difference between the number of shares that you own and the number of votes you may cast in the election. For example, in this election, a typical shareholder who owns 100 shares would have 300 votes, because there are 3 Board vacancies. 3 (vacancies) X 100 (shares) = 300 votes.

Even though there are three vacancies, you do not have to split your votes three ways. You may split them however you want or not split them at all.

A typical shareholder who has 300 votes could check the box of only one candidate and could fill in the blank next to the box by showing that this candidate should get all 300 votes.

Or, the 300 hundred votes could be split two ways, with 150 votes for each of two candidates.

Or, they could be split unevenly with 200 votes for one candidate and 100 votes for another.

Or, they could be split evenly, with 100 votes for each of three candidates.

Or, they could be split among more than three candidates, even though there are only three vacancies.

If you check one box and do not fill in the blank next to the box, all of your votes will be cast for that candidate. If you check two or more boxes, but do not fill in the blanks next to those boxes, your votes will be split in equal shares among the candidates whose boxes you checked.



SIGNING AND DATING

There are three more important lines on the proxy.

On the first line, which has the number "1" in front of it, you should fill in the date and the time that you signed the proxy. This is important because sometimes the Corporation gets two proxies signed by the same person. The rule is that the latest proxy is the one that counts. However, if the proxies are not dated, there is a chance that there will be no way to tell which proxy is the later one, and, therefore, neither one will be voted.

On the second line, which has the number "2" in front of it, you should sign your name exactly as it appears on the address label in the bottom left hand corner. Sometimes a proxy may be accepted if the name is not exactly the same, but there is a risk that it will not be valid. Proxies that are not signed at all will not be valid.

The third line, which has the number "3" in front of it, should only be used when a shareholder cannot sign his or her name because of age, illness, or other incapacity. If you have a friend or family member who falls into this category, make sure that the rest of the proxy is filled out the way he/she wants, and then fill in line 1, which gives the date and time the proxy was signed, and make sure that two witnesses sign in box 3.
