A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY AUTHORIZING FUNDING TO BUILD THE CAPACITY OF THE ASSEMBLY OFFICE AND ASSEMBLY COUNSEL'S OFFICE TO RESPOND TO THE COVID-19 EMERGENCY, FOR ONE HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$175,000) FROM THE CARES ACT FUNDS PREVIOUSLY APPROPRIATED TO THE STATE DIRECT/FEDERAL PASS-THRU GRANTS FUND (231900).

WHEREAS, the Municipality of Anchorage is a welcoming and resilient community, characteristics that have been tested and persevered during the COVID-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic has given us the ultimate appraisal of our resilience, and as a community we need to involve and educate businesses and individuals impacted and needing assistance to recover from the social and economic effects of the pandemic; and

WHEREAS, an agreement with the State of Alaska to accept One Hundred Fifty-Six Million Dollars of CARES Act funds were approved in AR 2020-199 at the June 2, 2020 Assembly Meeting; and

WHEREAS, the Municipality appropriated One Hundred Fifty-Six Million Dollars of CARES Act funds to the State Direct/Federal Pass-Thru Grants Fund (231900) approved in AR 2020-245 at the July 14, 2020 Assembly Meeting; and

WHEREAS, the funds provided by the CARES Act must be spent in accordance with Congress' directives and the U.S. Department of Treasury guidance, which includes administrative costs for the meetings, work sessions, research, drafting, and constituent relations and communications undertaken by the Assembly to understand the parameters for spending CARES Act funds, the community's needs and priorities, plan for allocating the funds accordingly, and educating the people of Anchorage on the allocation plan and the programs available to help them;

 WHEREAS, the Assembly's role as the legislative branch of our local government with the appropriations power is burdened with an increased workload due to COVID-19 emergency planning and response, and the diligence necessary for CARES Act funds distribution, and warrants adding capacity to the Assembly Department to manage this increase; now, therefore,

THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY RESOLVES:

Section 1. That the MOA is hereby authorized to fund an aggregate amount not to exceed ONE HUNDRED SEVENTY-FIVE THOUSAND Dollars (\$175,000) for the purpose of funding of increasing Assembly capacity through additional aide hours and hiring additional aide staff and support for the Clerk's and Assembly Counsel Offices [AN OUTREACH AND EDUCATION PROGRAM ON CARES ACT FUNDING, THROUGH THE ASSEMBLY DEPARTMENT].

Section 2. This resolution shall be effective immediately upon passage and approval by the Assembly.

A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY AUTHORIZING FUNDING TO BUILD THE CAPACITY OF THE ASSEMBLY OFFICE AND ASSEMBLY COUNSEL'S OFFICE TO RESPOND TO THE COVID-19 EMERGENCY, FOR ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$175,000) FROM THE CARES ACT FUNDS PREVIOUSLY APPROPRIATED TO THE STATE DIRECT/FEDERAL PASS-THRU GRANTS FUND (231900).

Purpose of the Resolution

This Resolution authorizes the Municipality of Anchorage (MOA) to fund capacity building for the Assembly Members and Assembly Counsel, to effectively respond to the COVID-19 emergency.

Background

The Municipality of Anchorage has a two branch governance structure with the Anchorage Assembly being the legislative and appropriation branch for the Municipality. In these unprecedented times, the Assembly Members, comprised of part time members and limited support, have been tasked with balancing the power of their administrative counterpart, the Mayor. It is the balance of power that provides the checks and balances on the actions of each branch of government, even during a declared emergency.

Further, the Administration has received substantial COVID-19 related funds through the CARES Act, which the Assembly must appropriate. The Assembly appropriated, when tendered, all the CARES Act money to a single fund for accounting and tracking. Specific expenditures are allocated for purposes described with each expenditure request and earmarked from that fund

The following allocations are currently proposed to provide relief from the impacts of COVID-19 and strengthen our local COVID-19 response, including interacting with stakeholders, receiving policy guidance and communicating with the public:

• \$50,000 to Assembly Counsel's office for purposes of a contract attorney

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and office management to assist with the increased work demands related to the COVID-19 emergency; and

\$125,000 to the Anchorage Assembly for purposes of increasing Assembly capacity through additional aide hours and hiring additional aide staff and support for the Clerk's and Assembly Counsel Offices.

Financing and Source of Funds

The funds for the Programs are proposed to come from the State of Alaska, CARES Act Funds, appropriated with AR 2020-199 and subsequently appropriated again by AR 2020-245, approved by the Anchorage Assembly on July 14, 2020 and must be encumbered or spent on or before December 31, 2020.
