THE OFFICE OF SPECIAL PROSECUTIONS CHARGES:

COUNT I

That in the Third Judicial District, State of Alaska, on or between May 31, 2019 and January 10, 2020, at or near Anchorage, ELISA JEAN VAKALIS engaged in conduct constituting a scheme to defraud one or more persons of \$10,000 or to obtain \$10,000 or more from one or more persons by false or fraudulent pretense, representation, or promise and obtained property or services in accordance with the scheme.

All of which is a Felony class B offense being contrary to and in violation of 11.46.600(a)(2) and against the peace and dignity of the State of Alaska.

COUNT II

That in the Third Judicial District, State of Alaska, on or between May 31, 2019 and January 10, 2020, at or near Anchorage, ELISA JEAN VAKALIS committed the crime of theft and the value of the property or services was \$25,000 or more.

All of which is a class B Felony offense being contrary to and in violation of AS 11.46.120 and against the peace and dignity of the State of Alaska.

COUNT III

That in the Third Judicial District, State of Alaska, on or about August 1, 2019, at or near Anchorage, ELISA JEAN VAKALIS with intent to defraud, made or caused a false entry in the business records of an enterprise.

All of which is a Felony class C offense being contrary to and in violation of 11.46.630(a)(1) and against the peace and dignity of the State of Alaska.

COUNT IV

That in the Third Judicial District, State of Alaska, on or about August 7, 2019, at or near Anchorage, ELISA JEAN VAKALIS with intent to defraud, made or caused a false entry in the business records of an enterprise.

All of which is a Felony class C offense being contrary to and in violation of 11.46.630(a)(1) and against the peace and dignity of the State of Alaska.

COUNT V

That in the Third Judicial District, State of Alaska, on or about September 23, 2019, at or near Anchorage, ELISA JEAN VAKALIS with intent to defraud, used an access device or identification document to obtain property or services with knowledge that for any reason her use of the access device or identification document was unauthorized by either the issuer or the person to whom the access device or identification document was issued, and the value of the property or services obtained was \$75 or more but less than \$25,000.

All of which is a class C Felony offense being contrary to and in violation of AS11.46.285(a)(3) and against the peace and dignity of the State of Alaska.

COUNT VI

That in the Third Judicial District, State of Alaska, on or about September 26, 2019, at or near Anchorage, ELISA JEAN VAKALIS with intent to defraud, used an access device or identification document to obtain property or services with knowledge that for any reason her use of the access device or identification document was unauthorized by either the issuer or the person to whom the access device or identification document was issued, and the value of the property or services obtained was \$75 or more but less than \$25,000.

All of which is a class C Felony offense being contrary to and in violation of AS11.46.285(a)(3) and against the peace and dignity of the State of Alaska.

The undersigned swears under oath this Information is based upon a review of police report 20-506991 submitted to date.

On May 27, 2020, Matthew Tomter filed a report with the Anchorage Police Department alleging embezzlement from is restaurants by contracted bookkeeper ELISA VAKALIS. VAKALIS was hired in February 2019 and was terminated in January 2020. VAKALIS was hired as an independent contractor bookkeeper to do the accounting and payroll from the Eagle River Alehouse, LLC, the Matanuska Brewing Downtown, LLC, the Anchorage Alehouse, LLC, the Matanuska Brewing Company, LLC, and Alaska Keg, LLC.

After VAKALIS was terminated, Tomter hired an accountant to do a forensic accounting of the books of the various companies. Melissa Steen, the accountant found issues with the books of three of the companies - Eagle River Alehouse, Matanuska Brewing Downtown, and the Anchorage Alehouse. No issues were found for the Matanuska Brewing Company or Alaska Keg.

Steen found three methods in which VAKALIS stole money from the companies - payroll, petty cash, and vendor misappropriations.

Payroll: VAKALIS was hired as a 1099-MISC independent contractor at \$385 a week per restaurant (\$1,155 total a week). The week of October 11, 2019, VAKALIS paid herself as both an independent contractor and as a W-2 employee of each restaurant. She continued to pay herself as a W-2 employee until she was terminated in January 2020. Tomter did not realize V AKALIS was paying herself as an employee until he was informed by Steen. VAKALIS also paid herself extra pay or bonuses on several occasions and gave herself a pay raise. Between the three restaurants, the alleged amount stolen categorized as "payroll" is \$9,379.73.

Petty Cash: VAKALIS made out several checks to "petty cash" even though the restaurants do not use a petty cash system per se but had house bank tills. There were several "petty cash" checks for which there were no receipts. The backs of four of the "petty cash" checks appeared to be signed by Leanne Parsons, the general manager of the midtown restaurant Anchorage Alehouse. However, according to Leanne Parsons, the signatures were not her signatures, but forgeries. Between the three restaurants, the alleged amount stolen categorized as "petty cash" is \$5,749.58.

Vendor: In reviewing the Key bank account statements for the restaurants, STEEN found two checks in the bank accounts of the Matanuska Brewing Downtown that were made payable to VAKALIS. However, when Steen looked at the Quickbooks entry for the check, the entry showed the checks had been made out to vendors -which would generally indicate that V AKALIS made the check out to herself then went back into Quickbooks and changed the record to reflect the vendor's name. The two checks were check 2399 on August 1, 2019 for \$2,500 and check 2407 for \$2,000 on August 7, 2019.

Additionally, Steen identified various credit card charges on a business credit card issued to VAKALIS for her bookkeeping duties. There were two large charges. One, a \$3,000 charge to a local law firm on September 23, 2019. This was a payment made on behalf of ELISA VAKALIS in her divorce proceedings. Second, on September 26, 2019, a charge for \$2,814.53 at L&M Motors for repairs on a 2013 GMC Yukon owned by ELISA VAKALIS. There were numerous smaller charges on the card issued to VAKALIS. The total amount of unauthorized credit card charges was \$7,069.90.
