THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY CHARGES:

COUNT I

That in the Third Judicial District, State of Alaska, on or about August 20, 2022, at or near Anchorage, TALLON COLT WESTLAKE recklessly caused the death of another person.

All of which is a class A Felony offense being contrary to and in violation of AS11.41.120(a)(1) and against the peace and dignity of the State of Alaska.

COUNT II

That in the Third Judicial District, State of Alaska, on or about August 20, 2022, at or near Anchorage, TALLON COLT WESTLAKE destroyed, mutilated, altered, suppressed, concealed, or removed physical evidence with intent to impair its verity or availability in an official proceeding or a criminal investigation.

All of which is a Felony class C offense being contrary to and in violation of 11.56.610(a)(1) and against the peace and dignity of the State of Alaska.

The undersigned swears under oath this Information is based upon a review of police report 22-27075 submitted to date.

On August 20, 2022, at about 0652 hours, the Anchorage Police Department (APD) communications center received a call from 907-The male caller indicated that he needed an ambulance at Rovenna Street, bottom floor. The male asked if they could get there in a hurry. The male was then transferred to the Anchorage Fire Department (AFD) Dispatch Center. While on the phone with emergency services the male caller indicated that he did not know what was going on with his dad and his dad was not awake. The male caller mentioned that he was scared and was not near his father. The dispatchers asked the male if he could get next to him, and he said "no" and that he did not want to be next to a dead body. The dispatchers asked the male to go near the body to see if he was breathing. The caller said he didn't think that he was.

The male caller was then given CPR instructions. The caller can be heard calling the name "Dad". He then tells dispatch that he is not breathing and confirms that he is cold and stiff.

Medics with AFD arrive on scene and determined that the male inside the residence was deceased and then place a blanket over the body.

APD officers SGT Blake and Officer Pohl arrived on scene and contacted a male who was outside of the residence. The male was identified as TALLON COLT WESTLAKE (), the initial 911 caller, and the victim was DEAN VICTOR WESTLAKE (

SGT Blake and Officer Pohl spoke with TALLON WESTLAKE and attempted to gain basic information about DEAN WESTLAKE, but he told officers that he did not want to talk.

After contacting TALLON WESTLAKE, AFD personnel contacted officers on scene and notified them of concerns.

Officers went inside the residence and located the body of DEAN WESTLAKE in the hallway. His body was covered by a blanket, but officers were able to observe blood on Dean's hands and feet.

SGT Blake described the areas of what he could see on DEAN WESTLAKE as being "pummeled." Officers also observed blood streaks in the walls in the hallway and blood spatter.

Officers on scene describe a heavy bleach smell inside the residence, wet floors that appeared to have been recently mopped and a mop in the bathtub. The washing

machine was also running with items inside. DEAN was lying on the floor in the hallway and it appeared that some of the blood around his hands and feet had already dried by the time police arrived. No one else was in the residence.

Based on the officer's observations of the residence and DEAN WESTLAKE, TALLON WESTLAKE was taken into custody on an active warrant and transported to APD headquarters for an interview with detectives.

While taking TALLON WESTLAKE into custody, officers observed a red substance, consistent with blood, on his hands and clothing.

Police received search warrants for the residence WESTLAKE's person.

Detectives attempted to interview TALLON regarding the incident with DEAN, but he did not provide any details. He did however provide a name and address for his , who he wanted to be contacted about DEAN. sister AUTUMN

Detectives Cordie and SGT Baker served the search warrant on TALLON. They observed apparent blood on his hands as well as some of his clothing. Detectives also observed that TALLON's right hand was significantly swollen. TALLON had some injuries, mostly scratches, that appeared consistent with his job as a welder but no other significant injuries on his body.

A tax property search was conducted of the residence located at Rovenna Street. The search revealed that the owner was a female named JULIE Through further research it was determined that JULIE is the girlfriend of the victim DEAN WESTLAKE.

Detectives called Julie who was in New York visiting family. Police learned from Julie and Autumn that the tenants of Unit A had recently moved out. TALLON was staying in the bottom unit and had not been paying rent. DEAN had travelled from Fairbanks on Monday, where he lived with Julie, for the purpose of fixing up the apartment and getting it ready to re-rent. He also planned to evict TALLON because TALLON had not been paying rent and had caused some damage to the floors by letting them get wet. AUTUMN said that yesterday DEAN contacted her and stated that TALLON had not paid rent in 4 months. DEAN was going to give TALLON a 30-day eviction notice. Julie also said she had talked to DEAN around 5:30 p.m. the night before and he seemed fine. They talked about being fed up with TALLON who had previous drug problems and a short temper. TALLON had been doing badly since the death of his mother about a year prior. Julie told police that DEAN had recently had his hip replaced and was on blood thinners due to a heart valve issue. She last saw him on August 12, 2022, and he appeared to be doing well.

Detectives interviewed the neighbor who lived across the street, Linda She said she got home around 2 or 2:30 a.m. that morning. She heard loud arguing coming from TALLON's apartment. said she thought it was a male and female arguing. She heard a lot of "F" you's and get the "F" out. The other person then said she listened to the argument for said, "Screw you. I'm not leaving." about 5 or 10 minutes while standing outside her residence.

The Anchorage Police Department Crime scene team was contacted for processing of the scene. Crime scene team members were conducting a walkthrough of the outside

of the residence, Officers observed what appeared to be a bloody towel inside in of blue sedan with Alaska license plates , which was parked in the driveway of Rovenna Street. The vehicle was registered to TALLON WESTLAKE.

When processing the scene, police found apparent blood spatter on the hallway walls, near where they found the body of Dean. Dean was lying face-down on the floor in the hallway. When the blanket was removed from his body, police could see his face was bruised and bloodied. He had bruising to both eyes and it appeared as if his lips were swollen. He had apparent blood soaking his head. Dean's body was transported to the medical examiner's office for an autopsy to occur sometime on or after Monday, August 22, 2022.

At the scene, police observed additional blood spatter in the kitchen, along the cabinets and walls. Police also found two ring cameras in the large trashcan in the carport outside the residence. Nothing other than the cameras was found in the trash can.
