Exploring a run for Alaska's At-Large Congressional seat

Bill Hill is Dena'ina Athabascan and a lifelong Alaskan.

Bill grew up in the small village of Kokhanok on the edge of Lake Iliamna in Western Alaska, and currently lives in Naknek with his wife Diane.

He grew up subsistence fishing and hunting, trapping, and raising and racing sled dog teams with his family. Bill is first and foremost a commercial fisherman, joining his dad on the family fishing boat when he was 12 and fishing every fishing season in Bristol Bay since.

Bill also worked in rural construction, from building houses, working on remote health clinics and canneries, environmental remediation, and on a crew that installed the sewer system in the Bristol Bay Borough.

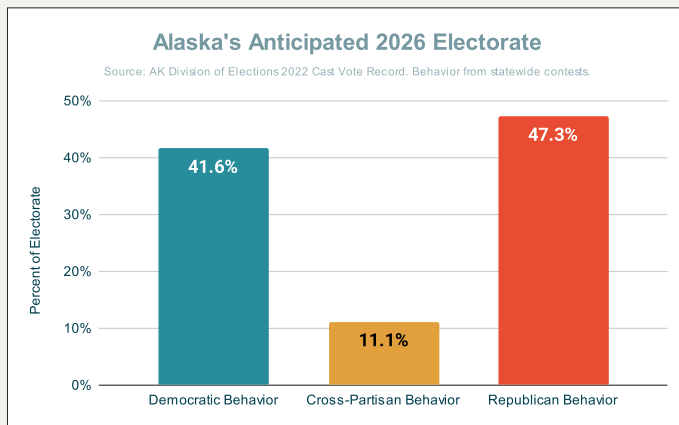
A son of two teachers, Bill spent nearly 25 years working as a teacher, a principal, and a superintendent, and was named Alaska Superintendent of the Year in 2023. He's a proud union guy, having belonged to both the Laborers union and the NEA.

Bill is a husband, dad of four, and Chada (grandpa) to 7. Bill and his family have lived in Anchorage, Fairbanks, and Juneau. Now he and his wife Diane are back in Naknek, population 470.



Taking back Alaska's House seat will be challenging. *Bill Hill can do it.*

The race for Alaska's at-large congressional seat will be a tough race against a Republican incumbent in a state Trump won by +13 in 2024. Nick Begich has already raised over \$2 million for his reelection campaign, and national Republicans will have their eyes and their dollars set on defending this seat.



We anticipate the 2026 electorate to lean Republican by 5.6 points. We also anticipate 11.1% of voters to be willing to vote for multiple parties on the same ballot. To win, a candidate will need to win over those ticket splitters who typically vote Republican but are willing to vote across the aisle for a candidate with cross-partisan appeal.



Bill Hill can build the coalition to win

Winning this race will require building a broad, durable coalition that reflects Alaska itself — including the progressive base, rural Alaska, union and trades workers, coastal fishing communities, and moderates in Alaska's urban hubs. Success depends on earning support from voters across the political spectrum, including many Alaskans who don't identify with either major party.

Bill has the profile to build that coalition. He is a pro-choice Independent from rural Alaska who has spent his life working as a teacher, commercial fisherman, and union construction worker, and who has lived in Anchorage, Fairbanks, and Juneau. His lived experience allows him to connect with voters based on shared values and trust, and to bring together people who may not always vote the same way, but who recognize that he understands the real economic pressures and uncertainty facing Alaskans — and is prepared to fight for them.

What Bill Stands For

Lower costs for working families

Bill supports reasonable, locally-backed resource development that creates good jobs for Alaskans. A longtime Bristol Bay resident, he opposes Pebble Mine as the wrong mine in the wrong place.



Defend women's right to choose

Bill supports a woman's right to choose, protected in Alaska's State Constitution and core to protecting privacy and freedom in Alaska.

Bill will defend the core freedoms of our democracy and will staunchly oppose any anti-democratic threats to our laws, rights, and institutions.
